Mike's Minutes

As I thought of a topic to speak on today, I remembered a statement that my doctor recently mentioned to me about losing weight. He asked, "What is your reach factor?" I had never heard it put that way before, though the thought made sense in fulfilling my goals of losing more weight. I'm proud to say I've lost 13

pounds, and now my small goal, "reach factor" is another 13 pounds, while my long-term reach factor is an over all 70 pounds.

This said, I also thought about our reach factor as a church member toward reaching out and building relationships with others. Quiet observation of human interaction will demonstrate that some have an almost effortless ability to reach others, while some can barely extend their hand whatsoever. I admire those with a great reach factor. They know how to go beyond themselves for the sensitivity of others. They may even pay the price of giving up their own preferences or being inconvenienced. The value of 'reacher' goes way up when you recognize how hard it is to be one.

I've logged a few years in church work...enough to feel sufficiently qualified to address some of the challenges of dealing with people in this environment. I've watched staff members willingly give up a portion of their own budget so that another department could flourish and experience success. That's reaching. I've been in close proximity when observing a pastor quietly lay down his own preferences to recognize there is another way to go about a particular project or service. That's reaching. I can even remember on occasion that I, too, have chosen to bend a few "hard and fast rules" because **reaching** demanded it...and in that moment, the voice to reach was louder than the voice to be rigid.

I fully understand that the "reach component" comes easy to some and not so easy for others. It seems to be built into one's personality. I've seen some choir members refuse to sit in a certain chair because they didn't like the cologne or the person next to them...or didn't care for the shoes the person next to them was wearing!

I want to be a *reacher*... a really good one. I'm probably not one of those for whom it comes easily, but I've learned to greatly appreciate it when I see it. In this "ME" centered culture, thankfully, I'm allowed to see it properly exampled in front of me through some of the quality people with whom I'm in relationship.

I recently heard a pastor share a sermon that reminds me of this:

That Great God, Who holds the seven stars in His one Hand. That Great God, Who made the Heaven and the Earth. That Great God, Who calls one day a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day. That Great God, Who created the galaxies, Who spoke and there was light. That Great God, Who laid down His royal crown, while all the angels watched … and Heaven watched as He laid down His crown and His royal robe and started stripping Himself, and reducing Himself like a funnel. Less and less and less He became until He started fitting into our solar system; until He started fitting into our years, into our months, into our days, our hours, our minutes and into our seconds. He humbled Himself and reduced Himself to become less and less until He fit into the womb of a woman. He did this for one reason and one reason only … so that you and I who were NOTHING could sit with Him in heavenly places for all eternity."

Now THAT, my friend, is reaching.
