## Mike's Minutes



I received a phone call in my office today, and I responded to a statement that was made with this: *'It seems there is so much to do and so little time, change is urgent!'* This statement caused me to once again start thinking of the church. I know we seem very content at dwelling in our comfort zone. But the time we live in is not a time of leisure and play—it is a time of harvest, a time for action. And we, the church, are not the only ones taking action. The devil surely is, too. If we don't move fast, we'll lose. Big time.

The foremost important thing that boggles me about servitude in the church is the lack of spiritual depth and guidance. There is this culture where so many of our congregation is involved in servitude before they are ready to take the plunge. So they are not necessarily ready or willing, it's based on guilt (of not fulfilling a friend, family or church figure's request), or a sense of fear that they might be viewed as not helpful or not participating in the church's progress, not taking part in the church's mission.

There is this belief that if you're not being pushed to plunge, you will never plunge. Sure, it may be true, but when you push someone without plunging in with them, that could be a problem. When a mother eagle pushes her children from the nest to force them to fly, she is still be watching them, preparing to fly to the rescue if the situation starts to be life-threatening. I see the church so often push people who are not ready to undertake the plunge. What happens so often is we tend to forget about them, and they fall in desperation and disappointment. The church is not a very good mentor. We get them on the roll, give them a job, and forget about them.

Sometimes the church focuses too much on the technical details that it forgets the most important thing in a person: their hearts. In their hearts, they keep commitment. In their hearts, they feel God's love and that love fuels them to act and take part in God's master plan. This fire keeps them going. If the fire isn't fed with oxygen, it will fade, out, and what do you have afterwards? Zombies. Empty shells. Lifeless people doing things because they have to. We should always be reminded that we are in the presence of Holiness. We are not worthy, but we will be instruments if we are willing to give our lives to God.

I could write more on this subject, but I must close. Basically, it's just stuff that boggles my mind. I may not be able to do much about it personally, but I can vent. I do know there is sooooo much work to do. The time we live in is a time of enormous trials, a time of complex problems that invade our lives and our churches. Advancement in our lives also means advancement in how the devil might influence us. So, advancement in our lives has to result in advancement in our ways of thinking and working. Improvements in the church are crucial and urgent. Our children/youth today need spiritual leaders and mentors in their lives.

After all, being a Christian is not a walk in the park; no sir, it's a call to battle.
