KIDS KORNER




Is VBS Really Important?

So many parents today have the idea that we should let our children make up their own

minds when it comes to religious instruction. I realize that each person has to come to Jesus personally of their own free will,





But there are better reasons than that for teaching our children God's Word and Ways. Let me give a few to think on as we get ready for VBS this month.

- It's Obedient to the Commands of God. Deuteronomy 6:6-9 tells us to teach our children God's Word, to live God's Word before them, and thereby to instill God's Ways in their hearts.
