Mike's Minutes

I am daily mindful of the privilege that it is to be your minister of music and youth director. I'm grateful for the call of God and for the opportunities he's given me to minister to your families.

given me to minister to your families. We need to be sensitive to the needs of others and to the times we can share the gospel with those around us.

After a very stressful week, not long ago, someone asked me, "Why would anyone choose to be a youth minister these days?" Yes, culture says: "Reduce stress. Simplify your lifestyle. Look out for your own interests. Maximize your income. Seek prestige." Youth ministry flunks every test. So, I asked myself, "Why did I chose a role that

So, I asked myself, "Why did I chose a role that automatically entailed stress, sacrifice, and several negatives? Why do you keep doing what you do?" The only answer I can give is it's because I'm responding to the unmistakable call of God to do so.

Part of the price you pay is the spiritual heart transplant you received as part of your salvation. You're sensitive to the hurt around you. And people are the most vulnerable, unpredictable, and hurting creations I know. And the more we bottle up the stress of dealing with the burdens of life, the more harmful it becomes.

A lecturer, when explaining stress management to an audience once, raised a glass of water and asked, "How heavy is this glass of water?" Answers called out ranged from 2g to 500g. The lecture replied, "The absolute weight doesn't matter. It depends on how long you hold the glass. If I hold it for a minute, that's not a problem. If I hold it for an hour, I'll have an ache in my arm. If I hold it for a day, you'll have to call an ambulance. In each case, the water weights the same, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes." He continued, "And that's the way with stress management. If we carry the burdens of life all the time, sooner or later, as the burdens becomes increasingly heavier, we won't be able to carry on." Sometimes we need to put the glass of water down and rest for a while before holding it again. So today before you return home this evening, put the burden of work down. Don't carry it home. You can pick it up tomorrow.

Yes, there is sacrifice and stress, of some degree, built into everyone's job. Fortunately, it's when I, as a youth minister, am faced with these difficult circumstances that I grow the most. I acknowledge these challenges, then I optimistically and realistically try to, in God's grace, make a difference in a less than perfect world.

So, my friend, why not take a while to just simply RELAX. Put down anything that may be a burden to you right now. Don't pick it up again until after you've rested for a while.

The truly happy person is one who can enjoy the scenery on a detour.

Life is short. Enjoy it!
