We Need Help!

I don't usually like to write an article for our Newsletter calling for help, but we are definitely in a situation that demands it. People often ask me why churches are constantly pleading for workers in their churches. My first



response is usually that we aren't praying for workers as we should be, after all, Jesus said in **Matthew 9:38**, "Pray you therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest." So we surely need to pray as any work done in His church should be founded on prayer. But there's more to it than that. If we are praying, and Jesus is calling, where are those who are responding to His summons?

I think a good deal of the problem is that we don't understand what He is calling us to. We think and categorize our work in the church as a burden and forget that in His eyes it is ministry. We just think of the Preacher, the Deacon, and those on staff as the doing the work of the ministry, but that is not the extent of it. All of His people are called to minister. **Ephesians 4:11-12** says, "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; **12** For the perfecting of the saints, <u>for the work of the ministry</u>, for the edifying of the body of Christ". The primary role of a Minister in the church is not be the chaplain for the congregation, but give himself to prayer and ministry of the word (Acts **6:4**). The Body of Christ is called to minister to each other.

We are in need of an assistant teacher for the Youth. We need some additional Nursery workers. We need some who will serve in Children's Church. We need help with RA's and GA's on Wednesday nights. And I'm sure there are other places we could sure use some dedicated, on time, servants. How are you fulfilling His call on your life to minister?

Isaiah 6:8 states, "Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me." Jesus is asking all of us today "Who shall I send? Who will go (*serve*) for me?" Will you? Will we?

Sometimes we forget what salvation means. We think it is just giving us a ticket to Heaven, and we forget that He saves us to serve. When we're saved we are called to share the good news of the Gospel (Matthew 28:19-20). When we're saved we called to shine before men to bring glory to God (Matthew 5:16). When we're saved we are called to serve the body of Christ (Philippians 2:4).

So I ask you, will you step forward to teach, be an assistant, help in the nursery, or with our children? We need you, they need you, but more than that, Jesus needs you. If you will answer His call let Lori Hopper, Konnie Smith, myself, or someone on the Nominating Committee know that you will serve for Him. Never forget obedience brings His blessings.

It's an honor to serve alongside you in His Kingdom work!
