## KIDS KORNER

With the WMU Emphasis, By All Means, children will learn that their entire lives should be lived on mission for Christ. The children's theme: Mission: My Life is based on 1 Corinthians 9:22. The challenge will be for children to live on mission daily so as they encounter friends and community members who do not have a personal relationship with Christ, they can share what God means in their own lives. It will allow children to deepen their understanding of their own faith as they learn ways they can share their faith and what they are learning with those around them. The month of September is the Eliza Broadus Offering for State Missions, with our church goal \$5000. Our children will learn about God's Appalachian Partnership (GAP) located in McDowell, KY and its North American missionaries, John & Shaughanessy Morris. Wednesday nights we begin at 6:30 PM with the Children's Choir, led by Mike Duncan, followed at 7 PM with GAs and RAs (girls and boys in Grades 1-6). #### Delight instead of a Duty

1 Corinthians 2:12-16

12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God.

13 These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy [al] Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

14 But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

15 But he who is spiritual judges all things, yet he himself is rightly judged by no one.

16 For "who has known the mind of the LORD that he may instruct Him?" But we have the mind of Christ.

"I just don't understand the Bible." That's a comment I hear quite often, even from believers. We can understand why those without Christ are unable to comprehend biblical concepts, but why do those who know Him struggle? Some people think that a seminary education is the answer, but I have met several trained pastors and teachers who didn't really understand the Word of God. They knew facts, but they had no excitement for the Scriptures or for the Lord.

The key is not education but obedience. As we act on what we read, the Holy Book "comes alive," and we begin to hear and understand the voice of God. However, if we have not obeyed what He's previously revealed to us, why would He give us His deeper truths?

Look at these two passages of

"The secret of the Lord is for those who fear Him" (Ps. 25:14),

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: a good understanding have all they that do his commandments: his praise endureth forever. (Ps. 111:10).

Living a fleshly lifestyle of disobedience to the Lord clouds our eyes, diminishes our ability to hear, and fogs our thinking. Although we have full access to the mind of Christ, our attachment to our own sinful ways keeps us from tapping into the rich treasures of wisdom that are found in His Word.

As you read the Scriptures each day, look for God's instructions. Then with reliance upon the Holy Spirit, commit to do what He tells you. When you obey His voice, He'll reveal deeper truths, and your understanding will grow. Soon your time in the Word will become a *delight instead of a duty.* 



## Choir Loft

I have a hard time each month of knowing the right thing to write about. So generally, I choose to write on things that may encourage you as a member of the church. I want to speak from my heart if I may today.

I felt something was wrong, but I couldn't seem to figure it out. I was trying to serve the Lord and share Him with others. Yet I found myself feeling strangely drained. Something had happened to my joy? Can I get a witness?

One afternoon, it hit me! I was devoting myself to *serving* the Lord instead of devoting myself to *knowing* Him. As a result, I was, like Martha of old, I was missing out on "that good part."

Maybe today you are like me. Don't let anything, even the desire to serve God, keep you from simply sitting at His feet and getting to know Him. Remember that He wants our hearts and love, not just our service. Although we tend to focus on what we want and what we do, God sees our hearts (1Sam. 16:7). Deep down, are we sitting at His feet, or have we become consumed with other things? Are we consumed with how we can *serve* God, or with how we can *know* Him? Let's not forget that God has come so that we might have eternal life and that we might *know* and enjoy Him forever. "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly," John 10:10

"And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent." John 17:3 On my way to work the other morning, I noticed the shrubs and the rose bush beside my garage desperately needed trimming. That morning, after my bus route, I rummaged through the garage to get the weed-eater, the electric trimmers, gloves, a hat, and the list goes on and on. After several minutes, I was confident that I had everything I needed. "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing." John 15:5


