Take the time to read Joshua 1:1-9, God showed Joshua three keys to rise above life's struggles and become a courageous follower of His. What can we learn from Joshua about becoming a "Courageous Christ Follower?"
Expect Challenges v-2, God told Joshua, "prepare to cross over the Jordan to the land I am giving the Israelites." Joshua knew that the task would be a challenge. The journey included disappointment and frustration. From battles with the enemy to gripes and complaints from the Israelites.

Disappointment and uncertainty lay just around the corner. Interpreting life's difficulties to mean that we are out of God's will, can cause us to postpone or sidetrack our adventure with God. We forget that doing God's will creates challenges and difficulties. Moses followed God's direction and

faced an insurmountable challenge at the red sea. Joseph ended up in jail. Daniel faced a Lion. John the Baptist was beheaded. When Peter refused to stop speaking about Jesus he was executed. Romans 1:17, teaches that, "God's righteousness is revealed from faith to faith." The journey with God is one step of faith after another. Each step brings challenges and frustrations. When we expect challenges, we will not run from them. Instead, we recognize that challenges are part of the adventure.

*Exercise Spiritual Muscles* vv7-8, A weight lifter builds his muscles by pushing them beyond their comfort zone. The same is true of "Spiritual muscles." We grow stronger in our walk with God by working our "spiritual muscles" beyond their comfort zone. In Joshua 1:7-8, God reminds


Joshua to obey His commands, as well as read the Bible and memorize verses. These exercises with daily prayer, are crucial in facing life's challenges. God also mentions the spiritual exercise, "Meditating" on the Bible. The Hebrew word translated as Meditating means, "to murmur" "or speak to one's self". When I mumbled statements like: "I can't do anything right" I know that Satan has filled my meditations with his lies. However, when I take "every

thought captive" and replace ungodly mumbling with statements from the Bible like: "the Lord is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear?" I am following God's command. As our "spiritual muscles" grow stronger, God leads us on more challenging adventures.

*Examine God's Goodness* v-9, God tells us that He is with us where ever we go. The Lord is with us when we examine and remember God's faithfulness and goodness in our lives. We dread the mountains before us, and sometimes forget the miracles behind us. One of my best friends says it like this: "God is good all the time, all the time, God is good." Amen!

Then He carves a new smiling face.


*My lips will shout for joy when I sing praises to You — I whom You have redeemed Psalm 71:23*
